EARLY CHILDHOOD TEACHER

This full-time lead teacher in an Early Childhood classroom (2-1/2 to 6 years of age) will provide supervision over the classroom community with keen awareness of all aspects on the classroom while also paying attention to individual and small group needs. The teacher will follow the Montessori pedagogy to ensure that students have a safe environment to support their physical, emotional and academic growth and development. In collaboration with colleagues, all faculty members are committed to fulfilling Woodinville Montessori School's mission and vision.

Responsibilities:

Teaching and Overall Faculty Responsibilities

- Create a prepared environment appropriate for students' developmental levels.
- Communicate with students in a nurturing, respectful manner, considering their varied learning styles and abilities.
- Plan and present Montessori lessons.
- Assess student work and provide prompt feedback.
- Monitor students' safety and social-emotional health.
- Maintain accurate records and observational notes of students' lessons and overall progress.
- Complete progress reports including a comprehensive narrative at the end of each semester.
- Communicate and meet with families as needed in addition to scheduled conferences.
- Collaborate with your level team to submit a yearlong curriculum plan.

Professionalism

- Follow all school policies, procedures, and DCYF licensing requirements.
- Stay organized to manage all responsibilities.
- Document all family meetings, accidents, incidents, and behavior as directed.
- Maintain confidentiality regarding school or staff issues.
- Maintain a clean, professional appearance.
- Be punctual throughout the day.
- Support school events through planning, attendance, and encouraging family participation.

Communication

- Build trust with families and maintain two-way communication.
- Respond promptly to requests from your supervisor and administrators.
- Communicate concerns to your supervisor in a timely manner.

Collaboration

- Participate and engage in problem-solving, decision-making, and planning for your classroom, program level, and school.
- Attend weekly meetings and training(s) as needed.
- Attend school events, which may include some evenings or weekends.
- Participate in school accreditations.
